The Discipleship Chat

He Rose

It makes all the difference in the world. Many religions have a founder/leader who gave what they consider to be good teachings, and led peaceful lives. But only one has a leader who actually rose from the dead.

And He didn't actually come to *found* anything or start anything. It was started way back in the beginning of the world (Genesis 3). Jesus came to **redeem**, to **atone**, to **reconcile** ... to **save**.

To **redeem**: He came to "buy back" a sinful race of humans who had rebelled and fell under God's judgement.

To **atone**: He had to pay *in full* the penalty of the sin of all. He could leave no part of the penalty unpaid. The measure of God's justice in punishing sin had to be satisfied totally.

To **reconcile**: Sin had alienated man from God. God did not move away; man did. Man's sin built the barriers between man and God. Jesus came to bring both together. However, since they were not equals, man must be brought back to God. Man's sin, offensive to a holy and just God, must somehow be removed, or dealt with. Because Jesus paid for it in full, He could bring man, forgiven, back into fellowship with God.

To save: to summarize the above – humanity is lost in sin, and deserving of God's eternal punishment. Jesus paid it all. To those who believe in Jesus as their Savior (and confess their sin, and seek to leave it), God gives full forgiveness of their sin, fills them with His Spirit which gives us the power to receive Him, believe in Him, and live as His children, and makes them His own dearly beloved, blood-bought children.

As we know so well (John 3:16):

"For God so loved the world that He gave His onlybegotten Son, that whoever believes in Him (Jesus) should not perish, but have eternal life."

Without the resurrection, Jesus was just a good man who was cut short and executed. But with the resurrection, Jesus "... was declared with power to be the Son of God by his resurrection from the dead ... through Him and for His name's sake, we received grace..." (Rom 1:4)

St Paul said, "If Christ has not been raised, our faith is in vain (1 Cor 15:14) ... But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep."

Jesus' resurrection shows us that God has accepted His offering of His life as the sacrifice for the full penalty and payment of the sins of mankind.

"Because I live, you shall live also." (Jesus – John 14:19) That's all the proof we need – Jesus' resurrection.

He is risen! He is risen indeed!!
